

Children's Literature Awards

In the spirit of making room for a linguistically diverse children's literature ecosystem and recognizing literary excellence in the field, the first Room to Read Children's Literature Awards (CLA) was initiated in 2023, with the support of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). The Children's Literature Awards is a global initiative of Room to Read that has flagged off from India. In 2023, the Awards recognized the creative brilliance of Authors, Illustrators, and Book Publishers across 16 categories in the Hindi language. The Awards will recognize more Indian languages in the subsequent years, making room for diversity in children's literature.

The India Gets Reading Campaign is rolled out from August 15 to September 8. This 25 day campaign unites communities, teachers, students, and stakeholders to enhance awareness around foundational literacy skills and spread the joy of reading. The 2023 theme, "Teachers as Changemakers," highlighted the crucial role of educators in shaping young minds despite various challenges.



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The Har Kadam Beti Ke Sang Campaign in 2023, focused on the theme "Me and My Digital World." This campaign emphasized the transformative power of technology for adolescent girls, highlighting their digital rights and encouraging their informed, active, and personalized engagement with the digital world.



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Annual Campaigns

Room to Read India rolls out two flagship annual campaigns: India Gets Reading (Literacy focused) and Har Kadam Beti Ke Sang (Girls' education focused).

- **Room to Read was presented the Children's Champion Award in Education category by the Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR).**



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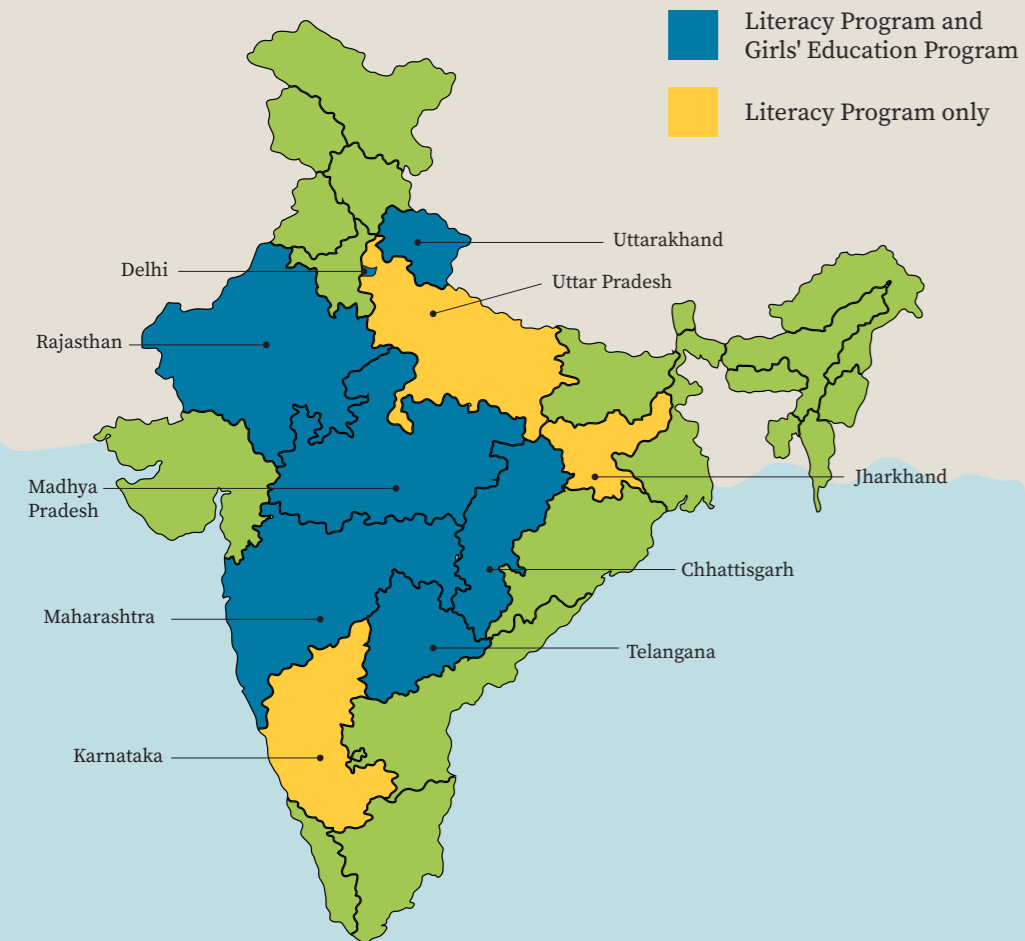
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ABOUT US

Literacy Program

Room to Read India's Literacy Program supports children in becoming independent readers and lifelong learners. Focusing on Grades 1 to 5, we train teachers and sustain students' reading skills by implementing innovative teaching and learning methods. Our aim is to instill a love of reading in children by creating child-friendly libraries and providing quality books in local languages.

Children's Book Publication

Room to Read's Quality Reading Material department, since 2005, has been dedicatedly working to publish a variety of children's books in regional Indian languages such as Hindi, Marathi, Urdu, Gujarati, Telugu, and Kannada. These books are also translated into various tribal and vernacular languages to ensure cultural relevance. As of December 2023, we have published 230 original book titles and distributed over 7,015,262 books.



Girls' Education Program

Our Girls' Education Program, covering Grades 6 to 12, focuses on a multi-year life skills curriculum to support adolescent girls, improve learning and life outcomes. It helps them graduate with critical thinking skills and the ability to address day-to-day challenges independently.



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Our program implementation approach

Room to Read works on a scaffolded "I-Do, We-Do, You-Do" approach to effectively implement and scale our programs. Under the "I Do" phase, we demonstrate our programs in selected government schools, then work in close collaboration with the government to scale up the model in selected districts partnership Schools – "We Do", and finally plan for state-wide engagement with increased government ownership "You Do" for sustainability.
